## A Recipe for Friendship:

## A Girl's Group Lesson

**Activity:** Students will discuss and learn friendship skills, such as initiating play and ways to spend time with peers

**Grade:** 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> grade girls (but can be adjusted to meet the needs of older students)

Time: 20-30 minutes

## **VSCA Standards:**

EP2. Understand how to make and keep friends and work cooperatively with others

EP4. Demonstrate good manners and respectful behavior towards others

**Rationale for Lesson:** The girls were selected to be in this group to boost their confidence and give them the tools to interact with peers in social situations

**Materials:** Book: *Enemy Pie* by Derek Munson

A Recipe Card: "A Recipe for a Great Friendship"

## **Method:**

1. Read the book *Enemy Pie* to the girls

- 2. During the story ask questions like, "Is he being friendly right now?" or "Is he being respectful to his classmate?"
- 3. Following the story, discuss what happened to the main character. Did he keep an enemy or make a friend?

- 4. As a group, we will create a recipe for friendship. Girls will say what they think some ideas are for building a friendship then the leader will write them on the Recipe Card handout. (If you wanted to use this with older students, they could write their own recipe for friendship, instead of doing it as a group or having the leader write)
- 5. Before closing the group, we will discuss what we think makes a good friendship and ways you can initiate play with friends

**Evaluate Lesson:** Girls will be able to say 1 thing that is needed in a friendship
