Activity:

This presentation focuses on the topic of bullying, including defining the different kinds of bullying (direct, indirect, cyber), consequences of bullying, suggestions on how to report bullying, what to do if you are a target, a bystander, or a bully to help stop bullying at the middle school. This information is covered during the course of a 50 minute class period.
